Spanish Courses Descriptions

Spanish 1 #1133091

This beginner course is for students with little or no background in Spanish. Students in this level are introduced to the sound system and pronunciation. They learn basic greetings, numbers, and everyday vocabulary. Students practice speaking in the present tense with regular verbs about daily activities, people and places. Emphasis is on speaking.

Spanish 2 #1135601

This Level 2 beginner course reinforces the basic grammatical structures introduced in Level 1. Students practice building short conversations about daily life, people, and places, and practice speaking in the present and in the future (“going to”). Students build vocabulary to talk about common topics. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 3 #1135603

This Level 3 beginner course reinforces the basic grammatical structures introduced in Levels 1 and 2. Students improve their use of present and future tenses and review the grammar used to describe people and places. Students are introduced to the past tense and continue to build vocabulary to talk about common topics. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 4 #1135604

This intermediate level course assumes familiarity with the present and future tenses and everyday vocabulary. Students are introduced to the past tense, and review the present and future tenses. Students build vocabulary to express themselves and talk about life experiences. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 5 #1135605

This intermediate level course reinforces the basic grammar structures covered in Levels 1-4. Students continue to build on knowledge of the past tense, and learn how to talk about life experiences in general and about specific times in the past with regular verbs. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 6 #1135607

This intermediate level course continues to build on the present, future and past tenses with regular and irregular verbs. Students will practice question forms and practice speaking about their lives and the people and events around them. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 7 #1135608

This advanced level course focuses on a variety of grammatical structures, and students use a mix of present, past and future tenses. Students compare various structures used to express themselves in the past tense and continue to build vocabulary and work on fluency and accuracy. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 8 #1135609

This advanced level course is for students ready to have longer conversations using a mix of present, past and future tenses about life, work, hobbies, interests and opinions. Students are introduced to phrases and grammar to help express mood, feelings and opinions. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

Spanish 9 #1135610

This is the most advanced level course offered, and explores more complex and sophisticated grammar structures. Students continue to improve fluency and accuracy and have longer conversations using a mix of verb tenses. This is an opportunity for students to gain confidence in speaking through activities aimed at recreating real world situations. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English (ESOL) Course Descriptions

English 1 (ESOL) #1118027

This beginner course is for students with little or no background in English. Students in this level are introduced to the sound system and pronunciation. They learn basic greetings, numbers, and everyday vocabulary. Students practice speaking in the present tense with regular verbs about daily activities, people and places. Emphasis is on speaking.

English 2 (ESOL) #1135542

This Level 2 beginner course reinforces the basic grammatical structures introduced in Level 1. Students practice building short conversations about daily life, people, and places, and practice speaking in the present and in the future ("going to"). Students build vocabulary to talk about common topics. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 3 (ESOL) #1135544

This Level 3 beginner course reinforces the basic grammatical structures introduced in Levels 1 - 2. Students improve their use of present and future tenses and review the grammar used to describe people and places. Students are introduced to the past tense and continue to build vocabulary to talk about common topics. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 4 (ESOL) #1135545

This intermediate level course assumes familiarity with the present and future tenses and everyday vocabulary. Students are introduced to the past tense, and review the present and future tenses. Students build vocabulary to express themselves and talk about life experiences. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 5 (ESOL) #1135546

This intermediate level course reinforces the basic grammar structures covered in Levels 1-4. Students continue to build on knowledge of the past tense, and learn how to talk about life experiences in general and about specific times in the past with regular verbs. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 6 (ESOL) #1135547

This intermediate level course continues to build on the present, future and past tenses with regular and irregular verbs. Students will practice question forms and practice speaking about their lives and the people and events around them. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 7 (ESOL) #1135548

This advanced level course focuses on a variety of grammatical structures, and students use a mix of present, past and future tenses. Students compare various structures used to express themselves in the past tense and continue to build vocabulary and work on fluency and accuracy. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc..

English 8 (ESOL) #1135549

This advanced level course is for students ready to have longer conversations using a mix of present, past and future tenses about life, work, hobbies, interests and opinions. Students are introduced to phrases and grammar to help express mood, feelings and opinions. Emphasis is on speaking. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc.

English 9 (ESOL) #1135550

This is the most advanced level course offered, and explores more complex and sophisticated grammar structures. Students continue to improve fluency and accuracy and have longer conversations using a mix of verb tenses. This is an opportunity for students to gain confidence in speaking through activities aimed at recreating real world situations. Classes are learner-centered, dynamic and interactive, and focus on effective communication and speaking. Students work collaboratively and are expected to participate actively in pair and group work, role plays, etc. Courses are held online or in person (workplace must be near Northampton). Ideal students for this course are non-native speakers who need to fine-tune their English.
